Ironwood

Resident Cost: \$120



Ironwood, also call Hophornbeam, is a tough understory tree with beautiful birch-like leaves, grayish-brown flaky bark, fine-textured drooping branches, and attractive hop-like fruits. Ironwood is considered one of Illinois' toughest native hardwoods and is not only ornamental but resistant to many disease and insect problems. Excellent tree for naturalized landscapes.

Mature Height: 25-40 feet

Mature Width: 15-40 feet

Light Exposure: Full sun (6 hrs direct light daily); Partial sun/shade (4-6 hrs light daily)

Preference: Moist, well-drained soil

Eastern Redbud

Resident Cost: \$112.50



Redbud is an outstanding understory or woodland edge tree for our mesic soil areas. The bright pink edible flowers illuminate the plant and mark the beginning of spring. This plant grows very quickly when young and slows only slightly as it ages.

Mature Height: 25-40 feet

Mature Width: 15-40 feet

Light Exposure: Full sun (6 hrs direct light daily); Partial sun/shade (4-6 hrs light daily)

Preference: Moist, well-drained soil

Autumn Brilliance Serviceberry

Resident Cost: \$85



Bursting with white flowers in the spring time, this small tree will fit into any sized landscape. It is grown either in a single stem tree or a multiple stemmed large shrub which is suitable for accent planting or privacy screening. The oval shaped leaves emerge coppery-red, becoming rich green throughout the growing season. Produces sweet purplish-black fruit which is promptly taken by the birds. The fall color is dramatic and outstanding.

Mature Height: 15-25 feet

Mature Width: 15-20 feet

Light Exposure: Full sun (6 hrs direct light daily)

Preference: Moderate, well-drained soil

Japanese Ivory Silk Lilac Tree

Resident Cost: \$132.50



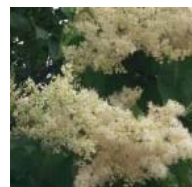
Japanese Ivory Silk Lilac is known for its creamy white flowers that bloom in dense clusters in late May to early June for about a two-week display. It is a low maintenance tree and considered the most pest-resistant of lilacs. It will tolerate poor soil conditions.

Mature Height: 25-40 feet

Mature Width: 15-40 feet

Light Exposure: Full sun (6 hrs direct light daily); Partial sun/shade (4-6 hrs light daily)

Preference: Moist, well-drained soil



Yellowwood

Resident Cost: \$170



Yellowwood is a slow growing, medium-sized tree with a broad rounded crown and bright green leaves that turn yellow-orange-gold in fall. Yellowwood is also prized for its early summer display of white, wisteria-like flower panicles that are borne heavily in alternating years or every third year. New trees may not bloom for the first 8-10 years.

Mature Height: 45-70 feet

Mature Width: 35-40 feet

Light Exposure: Full sun (6 hrs direct light daily); Partial sun/shade (4-6 hrs light daily)



Preference: Moist, well-drained soil

Marmo Maple

Resident Cost: \$115



Its foliage is ornamental, with leaves tinted red in early spring, developing to a rich green with silver undersides in summer. Fall color is an interesting mottled blend, ranging from combinations of red and green to burgundy, yellow, and gold. And unlike the silver maple, Marmo is seedless and a strong grower.

Mature Height: 45-70 feet

Mature Width: 35-40 feet

Light Exposure: Full sun (6 hrs direct light daily); Partial sun/shade (4-6 hrs light daily)

Preference: Moist, well-drained soil
